Salvation:

Yasha (Hebrew): verb--to rescue or be delivered

Soterion (Greek): adjective--to bring liberation (future tense)

Soteriology: The theological study of salvation

In Hebraic thought salvation was reconciling God with man relationally in this life. Its emphasis was on God rescuing man from whatever stood between Him and His creation.

In classical Greek thought, there was strong sense of dualism – that the material world is corrupt and worthless, and only the spiritual world was worthwhile. Therefore, salvation was defined as "being allowed to enter heaven after death." It focused on the
